Medford Food Co-op Annual Owner Meeting and Good Food Festival May 5, 2019

3:00-4:00 pm Business Meeting

Anne Carter, general manager, opened the meeting by thanking everyone for attending. She introduced the Board members and staff members present.

Anne spoke on the Co-op's success and community impact. Outline follows:

- Medford Food Co-op is growing and changing and so is the city of Medford.
- We conducted a survey last August to help us better understand and serve our customers. We heard from 666 owners and 79 non-owner customers. The survey taught us some new things about our customers. Results of the survey: continue focus on fresh, local, organic food; continue to reach out to the community; improve product selection.
- Examples of how we're changing the community for the better:
 - Opening the Café allows us to offer food that's not common in Medford, is attracting new customers, is allowing us to expand educational outreach.
 - Bear Creek Stewardship day more than picking up trash along the Greenway. It's a growing, coordinated effort to improve and protect one of Medford's most beautiful natural assets.
 - Rogue Valley Farm Tour collaborate with Ashland Food Co-op to promote local farmers.
 Offers the general public a one-of-a-kind opportunity to visit farms and let the farmers tell their stories.
 - Rogue Valley Food System Network mission aligns closely with ours, so it makes sense to work within this network. Highlights of RVFSN are: production of the Rogue Flavor Guide, leading working groups that focus on food system challenges, and facilitating networking among all participants in the food system.
- Summary of our Co-op's success:
 - ^o Sales in 2018 were \$5,104,000, a 6% increase
 - We supported 115 local producers, sales of their products = \$523,000
 - Average number of customer transactions per day grew 28% to 510
 - 313 new owners joined in 2018
 - Staff grew to 34 employees.

Board of Directors President Kellie Hill summarized the Board's work during 2018:

- Hosted three meetings to discuss the idea of expansion with owners.
- Focused on assessing the feasibility of our Co-op's ability to expand and what needs to be done to prepare for an expansion.

• Continued to recruit owners to serve on the Board so that we can maintain a 7-member Board. Kellie announced that Sarah Calhoun was elected to serve on the Board.* The results of voting on the recipients of Positive Change will be announced in the next newsletter.

Kellie and Anne answered several questions from owners. The meeting was closed at 3:50 pm.

21 owners signed up as attending the meeting. The Good Food Festival took place from 11:00 am to 6:00 pm and drew increased customers and sales to the store.

*In accordance with Bylaws Section 3.6 (Quorum and Voting) of the Medford Food Co-op – the quorum was satisfied, as all business transactions took place with a coinciding electronic ballot campaign. One hundred and seven five total owner votes resulted in the clear majority win of Sarah Calhoun to as an addition to the Medford Food Co-op Board of Directors.
